## ACTIVITIES COMMITTEE REPORT FOR MYRTLE TRACE ANNUAL MEETING 02/04/2023

The Activities Committee is a financially independent committee for planning, implementing, buying foods, drinks, supplies and decorations for all Myrtle Trace events that need funded. Activities are not funded through the Myrtle Trace Board of Directors Treasury and therefore admissions to events cover the costs of foods, drinks, entertainment, decorations and any other expenditures. Part of the planning process is estimating how many people will attend the event and what the per-person admission should be in order to meet projected expenses. The Committee Treasury funds are encumbered in advance to cover the estimated expenditures. In this way, the event chairpersons may be immediately reimbursed for expenses out of pocket. It is necessary that expenditures do not exceed the amount encumbered by the committee. The system works very well and eliminates the risk to the event chairpersons.

Some events at Myrtle Trace do not need the assistance of the Activities Committee, such as card clubs and recreational activities like bocce ball and shuffleboard. They do not need to answer to the committee but if a special need arises that our committee can assist with, we will.
