PROPERTY COMMITTEE

The abnormally hot weather is putting a great deal of stress on the centipede and other types of grasses. It is strongly recommended residents water their lawns on a regular basis, at least three times a week, and make sure it is getting a deep soaking to keep your lawn healthy.

There has been an increase in the pool usage this spring perhaps due to abnormally hot weather. In May the total number of individuals signing in was 516; however, from June 1st through June 18th the number was 790. The same time period for June 2013 the attendance number was 611 and in 2014 the number was 726. A new water fountain has been purchased and will be installed soon.

The high level of activity between the pool area and the Clubhouse has, at times, created a parking problem. Due to the popularity of both areas it is important that residents make sure when parking their vehicle they are occupying only one parking space and not one space and a portion of another.

The Property Committee recommended and the Board of Directors has approved a change to the Property Guidelines. In the section, Common Property Maintenance Agreement, the last sentence has been changed to read: Please contact your Phase Representative during the month of March or September, if you are interested in applying for a Maintenance Agreement. This change provides residents with an additional opportunity to make application for consideration of a Maintenance Agreement. A reminder will appear in the September issue of the News & Views.
