In addition, Al and his crew worked tirelessly to ensure Myrtle Trace roads were cleared and made passable as soon as possible and the cleanup efforts progressed smoothly.

The Board would also like to acknowledge and thank Leo Reger, Chair of the Property Committee, who spent many hours and days responding to calls and checking out “hotspots”. There isn’t enough room to mention the names of all the residents who assisted the Board of Directors in getting information out or who offered words of support. However, to all of you please know we sincerely appreciated your support and help. Thank you.

LISTENING SESSION

NEW PARKING REGULATION

The Board approved the recommendation made by the Architectural Review Committee (ARC) prohibiting parking of unlicensed, unregistered vehicles or covered vehicles in Myrtle Trace, effective January 1, 2017. Please refer to the ARC article for a full explanation.

TREASURER’S NOTES

For this month’s “notes”, I had planned to talk to you about our Operating Budget and our budget planning for 2017. However, something called Hurricane Matthew came along and has thrown everything off course. Our community took a hard hit and most of you, like my wife and I, had a tree or trees fall on our homes or yards, punch holes in our roofs or worse and maybe also got some water in our houses. We hope you escaped most of the damage and are well on the way to recovery. Just so you know, our Operating Budget was in good shape until Matthew, but like us as individuals, it took quite a hit. The clean-up costs as of our Board meeting on October 19th, stood at \$32,000 plus, with more expenses to come from leaning trees to be cut and removed and other repairs to be made.

The Board had been working diligently since August on the 2017 budget and was very close to completion, but will now have to regroup and plan on what to do and where to go from here. We will carefully study and assess our options to come up with the best solutions and by our November Board meeting we will have the answers in place on how to proceed. Thanks for all the work you did as homeowners to help Myrtle Trace recover from this misfortune.



PROPERTY COMMITTEE

I'm sure by now everyone is sick of hearing about our friend Matthew. I just want to mention a few things. First, I want to send out a big thanks to Al Hardee and his crew, Truitt-Hardwick and their crew, all the neighbors, board members and committee members who answered calls and all those who helped with the clean-up to get our community back in great shape this quickly. Amazing! I know there is much to do, but please be patient and I'm sure things will get back to normal in due time.

During the storm I had many calls, as I'm sure other people did, concerning the lake levels and flooding. Unfortunately, our drainage is all dependent on areas around us that are out of our control. The county ditch, which flows into the inner coastal waterway and the drainage through Burning Ridge Golf Course to the Legends Golf Course area are what determine how high our levels rise. Because of the rainfall we had prior to the storm, our water table was already at high level causing extra stress on our drainage system. Please give this some thought the next time a major storm is in the forecast. If you are prone to flooding, and I think you know who you are, you might want to think about purchasing sand bags or even top soil bags to protect your property. Purchasing flood insurance may also be a good idea. I don't believe it is that expensive, and it offers peace of mind in case there is another storm. Thank you and stay safe.







Architectural Review Committee_ Tree Removal- Oct.2016

Due to the large number of trees, mostly pine, that are leaning, damaged or down in the community, the Architectural Review Committee is recommending to residents the removal of all pines that are leaning at an angle more than 11:00 or 1:00 on the clock. We feel that these are a potential danger to the homeowners and their property. We would like to keep a record of all trees you have removed during the storm and trees to be taken down in the future, so we are asking you to submit a Project Request Form requesting future removals and documenting removals that have already taken place.

Due to the fear of future storms, some residents are also asking to remove healthy pine trees as a precaution. We will consider removing these upon submission of a Project Request Form from the homeowner. In this case, we will be requiring the replacement of these trees with a substantial tree such as a birch, maple or oak.

We understand the reluctance of homeowners to have these large pine trees on their property, but we also feel the need to maintain the wooded appearance that attracted many of us to Myrtle Trace when we purchased our property. If you have any question regarding this policy, please feel free to contact any member of the ARC. (See the back of the Myrtle Trace phone directory for names and numbers.)
