BOARD BRIEFS

2017 ANNUAL BUDGET

After numerous meetings and hours of deliberation, by late September the Board was confident that we had a good budget in place for 2017. However, the large expenses resulting from Hurricane Matthew necessitated in a significant reconsideration and rewrite of the proposed budget. Our goal was always to be able to present a budget that would meet our needs in 2017, but also look to the future and be able to address our aging infrastructure, including the condition of our lakes and, most importantly, set up a designated Disaster Fund for possible future events such as experienced with Hurricane Matthew.

During our reworking of the budget, we considered approximately 10 different options, keeping in mind not only our financial needs, but also the impact on homeowners. Originally, at the end of 2016 we expected to have sufficient remaining revenues from our Operating Budget to finance our Road Resurfacing Fund and Repair and Replacement Fund contribution for the 2017 budget. However, those assets now are being used to pay Hurricane Matthew cleanup expenses (\$36,300 to date) t and estimated to be as much as \$43,000 upon completion.

We realize no homeowner is ever pleased with an increase in their dues. However, we concluded a dues increase, rather than a large assessment, was the best way to handle our finances. Our responsibility is to maintain and preserve the Myrtle Trace community as a whole. As per our Covenants, Article V, Section 3(b) your Board is authorized to increase the current dues by no more than 10%. Therefore, effective January 1, 2017, monthly dues will be increased to \$82.50 per month, or \$990.00 per year (\$75.00 x 10% equals \$7.50 for a monthly total of \$82.50). While we sincerely regret having to raise dues, if you carefully review the 2017 budget, we believe you will be satisfied that all obligations due to Hurricane Matthew and the future maintenance and preservation of Myrtle Trace have been addressed.

It should be noted that even with this increase, we will have to wait until possibly mid-year of 2017 to fund the Road Resurfacing and Repair and Replacement Funds, which we normally would have done in January. This will also enable us by the end of 2017 to have sufficient resources to finance the Road Resurfacing Fund and Repair and Replacement Fund contribution for 2018. Also, the 2017 budget will include, under Projects Scheduled, two line items for Infrastructure and Lakes Renewal, along with a Designated Disaster Fund. We carefully considered each expenditure and had to make adjustments, but the standards that you've come to expect from Myrtle Trace will remain the same.

Please review your 2017 Budget so that you can be assured Myrtle Trace remains financially sound, able to meet its obligations and has put in place a plan for the continued success and well-being of our community. We appreciate your understanding as we go through these difficult times.

LISTENING SESSION

The Board of Directors held the fall Listening Session on Wednesday, November 2, 2016. Between thirty-five to forty residents attended and many of the concerns and questions related to the aftermath of Hurricane Matthew. Some of the questions asked and areas of concern related to: the Horry County ditch; controlling lake levels; swale areas; removal of tree branches from lakes; golf course maintenance of their ditches; abusing volunteers; planning and paying for future "disasters"; and the availability to review engineering plans for Myrtle Trace.

We thank all residents who attended this listening session. The Board will be reviewing all questions and comments and the appropriate Committee Chair and/or the Board will be responding. Again, to all the residents taking time out of their day to attend this session we say, thank you. It is your input which helps us to identify the areas of concern in our community.



HURRICANE MATTHEW UPDATE

From the looks of things in Myrtle Trace, it would appear that we've completed our cleanup, but much remains to be done and we appreciate your continued help and patience in that regard. As indicated in our most recent, and final, notice on cleanup efforts, Hardee Maintenance has completed their pickup of debris from homeowner properties.

It is now your responsibility to remove any remaining Hurricane Matthew debris.

TREES:

Please continue to review the interim ARC Tree Removal policy due to Hurricane Matthew which was included in your November News and Views and is also posted on our web site, www.myrtletracesc.org.

COMMON GROUND TREES:

At the November BOD meeting, AMC Tree Removal, was selected at a cost of \$3,700.00 to remove 11 trees that are posing a danger to our community.

TREES IN LAKES:

We were in the process of obtaining bids for removal of seven trees that had fallen into lakes, one of which was for \$10,000.00. However, Al Hardee Maintenance took it upon themselves to remove all seven trees, resulting in a possible savings of \$10,000.00. Thank you to Al and his crew for another example of their quick action and dedication to this community.

FINANCIAL IMPACT:

As reported at November's BOD meeting, we're estimating our cleanup cost will be approximately \$43,000.00 when all is said and done. However, with the approval of the 2017 Budget, which includes a dues increase of \$7.50 per month, for a new monthly total of \$82.50, we are confident that we will meet our obligations due to Hurricane Matthew, continue to maintain and preserve Myrtle Trace in the coming year, and enable us to put a plan in place for our continued success and well-being.

COMMUNICATIONS COMMITTEE APPOINTMENT

Jon Bourne has been appointed to the Communications Committee. We welcome Jon and thank him for willingness to serve. Jon will be working with Ted Ackley, Communications Chairman, to develop and maintain an email data base to be used to communicate to our residents in times of emergencies such as a Hurricane Matthew event. We currently have email addresses listed in our MT Directory, but Jon will develop a program to have these addresses available to us in order to send out notices. This communication method will only be used when deemed necessary by the Board, and will not be used for any other purposes.

We are also looking into a program, Dial My Calls, a communication system that would allow us to automatically send out brief messages to a telephone number you provide. This will be another means of alerting and keeping you updated on important issues facing the community.

Both of these programs are strictly voluntary, and more information will follow in the next few months, We hope you will sign up for both programs as it's a benefit to you and the community to be kept updated and well informed.



ARCHITECTURAL REVIEW COMMITTEE

This is just a reminder to all residents that the new Policy for Parking Covered, Unlicensed or Unregistered Vehicles goes into effect January 1, 2017. The penalty for parking any of these vehicles anywhere on the property, except in the garage, is the same as that for the parking of trucks or recreational vehicles.

ARC appreciates the cooperation we have received from homeowners who have reported and requested the removal of storm damaged trees. If you have removed downed trees and not reported these to us, we would appreciate your doing so in order for us to accurately keep our annual tree removal total. All tree removals now need review and approval by ARC.


MINI GOLF






