## BOARD BRIEFS

### LAKE DREDGING

Dave Smyth, chair of the Lake Action Committee, reported that the committee had sent out six letters for dredging proposals and received two responses. The two bid proposals were reviewed and the committee was recommending one to the Board for approval. The proposal includes dredging of lakes: Oriole; Sparrow; and a small portion of Cormorant. The proposed contract, recommended by the committee, has been sent to our attorney for review prior to formal Board approval. We anticipate a contract being signed within the next month and expect dredging to begin thirty days after the contract has been signed.

The Board wishes to thank all of the members of the committee for their time and effort. The committee will continue the process of identifying the next lake(s) to be dredged and recommend the amount of funds to be included in the 2019 budget.

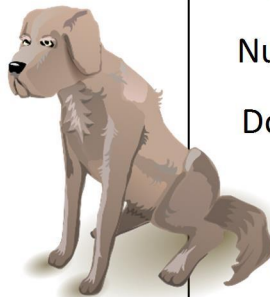
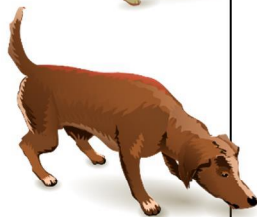
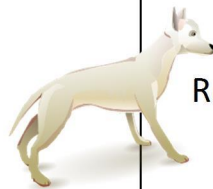
