BOARD BRIEFS

BAR CODE READER

A new bar code reader for the exit gate has been ordered, the replacement cost is \$10,604.00. The majority of the replacement cost is being paid by insurance and the balance being paid by the insured. It will probably be four to six weeks before the gate is back in operation; in the interim, your patience is appreciated.

LAKE DREDGING

The Board has contracted with Estate Management Services, Inc. for dredging of Lake Oriole, Lake Sparrow and a small portion of Lake Cormorant; specifically, the area closest to the golf course off Wedgewood Drive. The dredging work will begin within thirty (30) days and should take up to ninety (90) days thereafter. All dredged material will be placed in de-watering bags, once it has dried, will be disposed of offsite. The total cost is \$20, 953.76 and is being paid for out of the Lake Preservation Funds. The reason for dredging the lakes is to remove the silt which has accumulated over the years and renew the health of the lakes. Just a reminder, dredging does not prevent flooding or decrease the possibility of flooding during a major storm.

DUES PAYMENTS

If you pay your homeowner's dues on a monthly basis remember the payments are due on the 1st of each month. Late payment may result in a late fee being assessed.

ARCHITECTURAL REVIEW COMMITTEE

The Architectural Review Committee has added a new section to the Homeowner's Guidelines regarding windows. The new section will read as follows: "Wood frame windows painted the color of the house or dark bronze metal windows are the standard for the community. In addition, vinyl windows may be used for replacement. The color must be coordinated with the house and a sample of the window color must be approved by ARC prior to installation. In Phases I-VII, white windows or doors are not allowed anywhere on the house."

We have also re-painted the paint samples which are stored in the ARC cabinet in the clubhouse. There are some sample cans of each color in the cabinet for your use if you are thinking about changing your house color.

Looks like spring is finally here, so please remember to submit your Project Request Forms for any outdoor project you have planned. Have a great spring and enjoy the warm weather.

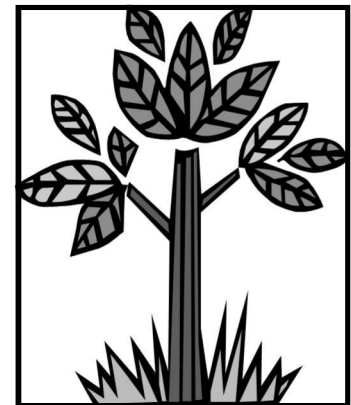
The next regular meeting of the Garden Club will be held on Thursday, May 10th at 1:00 p.m. in the Clubhouse. All Tracers are welcome.

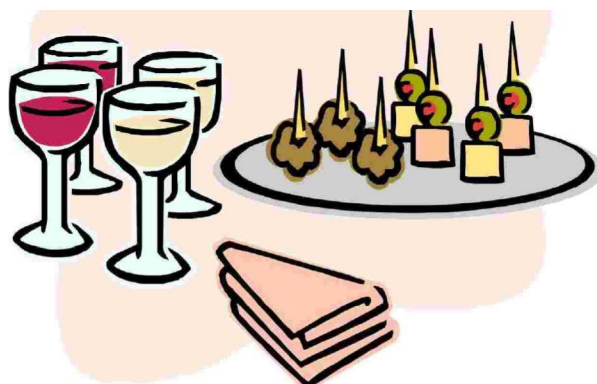

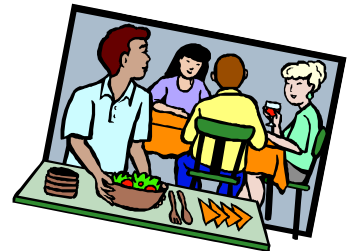
