BOARD BRIEFS

DREDGING UPDATE

The company the Association has contracted with to do the dredging, Lake Estate Management Services, is currently completing a couple of other jobs they had started. Therefore, it was necessary to postpone starting the dredging in Myrtle Trace. We are hopeful the dredging will begin by mid-June.

PATCHING AND CRACK SEALING IN MYRTLE TRACE

A member of the Property Committee, Tom Gray, has been obtaining bids from paving companies, since early March, for patching potholes and sealing “spider” cracks in various locations in Myrtle Trace. At our May Board of Directors Meeting, Tom presented bids from three companies. The Board approved awarding the contract to Pavement Solutions Corporation (PSC) as recommended by the Property Committee. The total cost of the project will be approximately \$4,125.00 and includes removing the temporary cold patches and removing the damaged pavement adjacent to them. This is a busy time of year for paving companies and we expect it may be up to six weeks before any work begins. We wish to thank Tom for all his time spent researching this project.

MYRTLE TRACE FINANCES

As of April 2018, our Association continues to do well financially. Our total income as of the end of April was \$178,250.00 which exceeded our expenses by \$46,382.00. Of that amount, \$13,740.00 will cover the designated fund contribution which will complete our 2017 obligation. All in all, our Association is in good shape financially.
