Because of this, our community is one of the few that has low monthly dues. Myrtle Trace Drive was a test to see if this process would prolong the life of the roads since the MTHOA owns the roads. If we were to repave the roads the cost would be approximately 2 million dollars. There are 518 home owners in our community. The assessment would be \$3,861 per home.

In closing, the Board like to thank all of our residents who volunteer and serve on our committees. We would love to see more residents getting involved in the community.

Remember, Myrtle Trace is a Community not a Neighborhood. We should treat our Neighbors with respect.

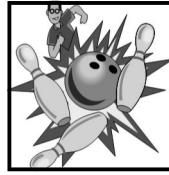
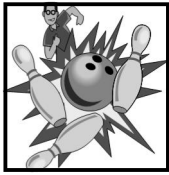
PROPERTY COMMITTEE
