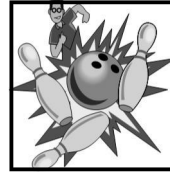
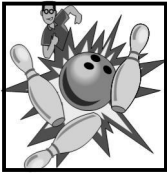

MYRTLE TRACE GATES

The gates at the end of Myrtle Trace Drive are in their tenth year of operation. Once the County paved Myrtle Ridge Road it became necessary to privatize our roads to prevent nonresidents and commercial traffic from using Myrtle Trace Drive as a speedy shortcut to avoid Route 501.

- In order to use the gates, a vehicle must have a decal or barcode on the driver's side rear window.
- Decals are only issued to homeowners and residents of Myrtle Trace.
- Since a record is kept of all decals issued, decals should not be transferred from one vehicle to another. When you get a new car, get a new decal.
- To get a decal, please call Nancy Seeds at 843-347-6615 to arrange a convenient time to have the decal put on your vehicle.

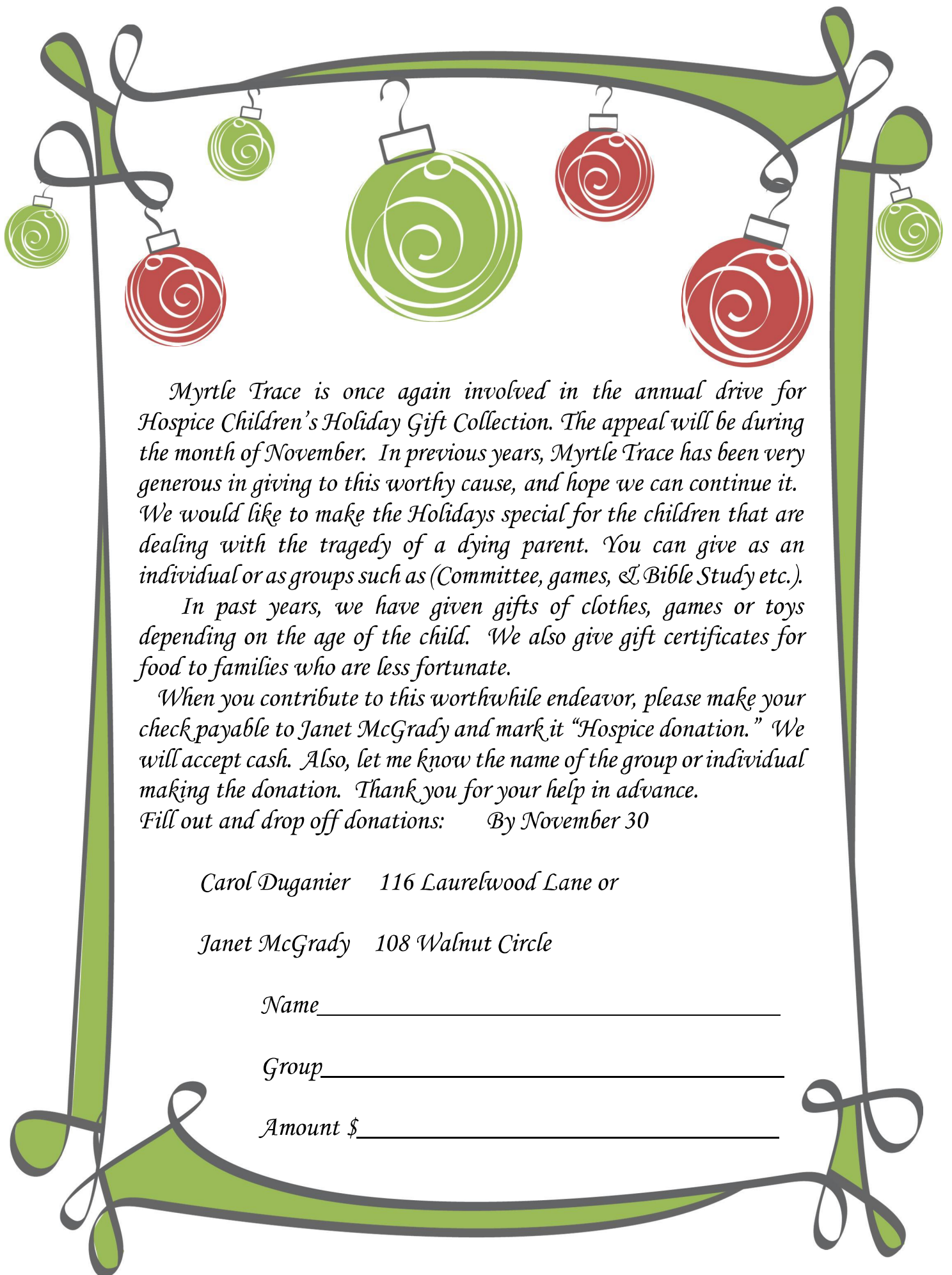

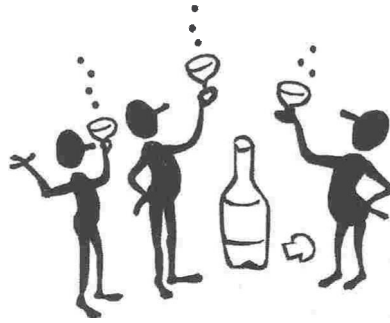
