ITEMS FOR BOARD ACTION

On January 20, 2019, the MTHOA Board of Directors passed a policy on Publication of Notice. This policy requires any proposed changes or additions to Board policies, procedures and Committee guidelines to be printed in the *News & Views* the month prior to Board action. You will see a new section in this issue of the News & Views titled **ITEMS FOR BOARD ACTION**. All items of new/revised policy or guidelines scheduled to be acted on during the March18, 2020 board are described. Residents who have concerns or opinions regarding these proposed changes are invited to contact a member of the Board through email, write a note and drop it in Homeowners box outside the clubhouse (no later than Wednesday, March 11, 2020) or attend the March board meeting and express your opinions during the Resident Participation portion of the meeting. The final action of these items will be published in the April issue of the *News & Views*.

Policy on Renting Homes: Proposed revision to Board policy: ADD sentence "The minimum length of time a home may be rented or when an agreement is being renewed is ONE year". (If enacted, the policy revision will also be noted on the Owner Tenant Agreement).

Guidelines For Hosting An Event: Proposed revision: Item #8 under section 5 – Change wording to read: "Refund Policy: Refunds must be requested at least 7 days prior to event. Flyers should reflect this to remind attendees of this policy".

Check List For Cleanup and Maintenance of Clubhouse: Proposed revision to item #`1 which will now read: "All clubhouse dishes, cups, glasses, bowls, utensils, pans, coffee pots, etc., that have been used for your event are to be washed, dried and items placed where they were originally stored, the same day as the event. Dish pan and detergent are under the sink".

CLUBHOUSE OPENS WITH NEW KITCHEN

The Clubhouse is now open with a brand-new kitchen for your use and enjoyment. Highlights of the new kitchen include all new cabinets with special storage for trays and a pull-out cabinet for trash containers; three ovens and a microwave; low maintenance quartz countertops; and updated ceiling lights and new undercabinet lighting.

A special feature is a new beverage bar with sink and undercounter refrigerator on the outside kitchen wall next to the storeroom door. This can be used for all beverage preparation and service, alleviating congestion in the main kitchen and eliminating the need to carry heavy coffee pots filled with water to and from the main kitchen.

What you will not see in the kitchen is a stove with surface burners. The Clubhouse is considered a commercial building and the current Horry County Building code requires a commercial range hood if there are any burners. The cost of such a hood is \$19,000. After consulting with many individuals, the Planning Committee determined that there is not enough cooking done in the kitchen to justify an expenditure of this magnitude. Thus, the three warming ovens and microwave are available for reheating food but surface cooking (including the use of electric frypans or hotplates or "anything that would produce grease vapors") is prohibited.

A project of this magnitude requires the help of many. Special thanks to the following: all Myrtle Trace residents for your patience and understanding while the Clubhouse was closed for construction. The MTHOA Board of Directors for their commitment and on-going support of the project. General Contractor Dan Bowden of Compass Designs who went above and beyond to ensure that every element was completed to perfection. Cabinets -n- Stock, supplier of the cabinets and countertop, for honoring a cost estimate made 18 months ago and doing customization to fit our needs. Nelson Fisher, Mickey Jarossy, Anne Kongvold and Liz Maass, members of the Planning and Implementation Committee who began meeting in March 2018, and continued to work through February 2020, to see the project through to completion.
