#### GEESE

Just a reminder that in Myrtle Trace and in Horry County it is a violation to feed the geese. [Myrtle Trace Policy on the Feeding of Waterfowl and Wild Animals]. The Horry County ordinance prohibits the feeding or providing of food for domestic or migratory waterfowl in residential areas. Violators in Myrtle Trace may be fined. Horry County considers this a misdemeanor, punishable by fine and/or imprisonment. Remember too, that although the geese do cause problems for residents, they are protected under the Federal Migratory Bird Treaty Act.
