#### **United States Flag**

In accordance with the U. S. flag code, the U. S. Flag at the entrance to Myrtle Trace will be flown at half-staff on September 11, Pear Harbor Day, and until noon on Memorial Day. At all other times, the Board of Directors will decide whether to participate when the President of the United States or the Governor of South Carolina directs the U. S. Flag is flown at half-staff on Federal or State facilities. When the U. S. flag is flown at half-staff, both the State and the Myrtle Trace flags will also be flown at half-staff.

Residents who have questions or concerns regarding these proposed policy changes may express them during the Resident Participation portion of the June 16<sup>th</sup> Board meeting.


