Burning Ridge Golf Course management has asked Myrtle Trace residents refrain from walking dogs on the golf course.


Once again residents are reminded to please obey speed limits and stop signs in Myrtle Trace. This is for the safety of all.

POSITION AVAILABLE

The Myrtle Trace Homeowners Association will receive the applications of interested persons to provide, as a private contractor, Property Secretarial services. The Property Secretary retained shall receive, for his or her services, compensation of \$900.00 per year. Said amount shall be paid in equal monthly installments of \$75.00 on the first day of the month.

The Property Secretary should have a working knowledge of Microsoft Word and Excel.

The monthly duties of the Property Secretary include but are not limited to the following:

Send out to members of the Property Committee the monthly agenda submitted by the Chair prior to second Tuesday of the month.

Scribe the minutes of the monthly Property Committee meetings.

Within one week after the meeting the Property Secretary will submit a draft of the minutes to the Property Chair and Vice Chair. After review by the Chair and Vice Chair, the draft will be submitted to Property members and Board Liaison for review.

The Property Secretary will be responsible for forwarding all monthly Property approved minutes to be posted on the HOA website.

Provide fourteen (14) copies of unapproved minutes to Board Recording Secretary by the Saturday preceding the monthly Board of Directors meeting, except when the Property meeting is the day before the monthly Board meeting.

The Property Secretary will be responsible for the MTHOA/HOMEOWNER AGREE-MENT database.

Maintain the database with name, address and phone number.

Provide update in April and October.

Provide a copy of document to Property Chair, Vice Chair and Board Secretary/ Treasurer.

The Property Secretary will provide orientation, training, and relevant updating relative to the responsibilities under this contract to an individual(s) designated by the Board of Directors.

Any other reasonable duties to be agreed upon by the Board of Directors for the Association and the Property Secretary.

The Property Secretary shall provide, at her/his own expense and on her/his own premises, the necessary equipment, software and supplies for the performance of the agreed services.

REZONING

Some residents have noticed the rezoning sign near the entrance at Lakeside Crossing on Myrtle Ridge Road. It stated there would be a public hearing on October 7, 2021, which allows interested parties to make statements or comments regarding the request during the Public Hearing portion of the meeting.

I was told the rezoning request was to change the current zoning to allow building condominiums on the property. I called the office of Lou Conklin who is the Senior Planner for the Horry County Planning Commission. One of the office personnel told me the request for rezoning at Lakeside Crossing had been withdrawn. That was good news, but it doesn't mean at some time in the future another request for rezoning there will not happen.

Another area of concern is the development taking place off Myrtle Ridge Road, on the left hand side, as you drive towards route 544. A large area of land has been stripped and Lakeside Crossing is also expanding. It is said between the two there will be approximately 1100 new homes which will have a major impact on traffic on Myrtle Ridge Road.

A BRIEF HISTORY OF THE BACK GATES

Long time residents may remember a time when there was only one way in and out of Myrtle Trace and that was by way of our main entrance at Burning Ridge Road. There was a permanent barrier at the other end of Myrtle Trace Drive where the gates are now and what is now Myrtle Ridge Road was nothing more than an impassable dirt track connecting Rte 501 to Rte 544. In 2008 Horry County paved Myrtle Ridge Road to make use of that connection between 501 and 544 to alleviate some of the traffic congestion on 501. The County also insisted that we remove the permanent barrier at the end of our road, making Myrtle Trace Drive a convenient short cut for non residents to avoid traffic lights and congestion. Of course our 25 MPH speed limit was ignored and non-resident traffic sped through our community, creating a serious problem for the safety of our residents.

When negotiations with the County failed to alleviate this danger, our only option was to privatize our roads. We discovered that we in fact owned the roads in our development and had given the County a right of way in exchange for the County's promise to pave and maintain the roads. After a number of court proceedings our roads did become private, the County right of way was rescinded, and we set up a "road resurfacing fund" setting aside \$31,080 every year to maintain and resurface our roads. All of this occurred 13 years ago and was more involved and complicated than what can be conveyed in a short message such as this.

But the gates at the end of Myrtle Trace Drive have served us well over the past 13 years, allowing our residents a second entry and exit to our community and most importantly preventing nonresident traffic from using Myrtle Trace Drive as a shortcut to avoid Route 501.

A lot of research went into deciding what kind of gate system would best suit the residents of Myrtle Trace. The current system of a barcode decal placed on the driver side vehicle rear window that is scanned as the vehicle approaches the gate was chosen over such things as keypads and card swiping since the permanent decal is easier for our residents to use and provides us with some sense of security that non residents will not be using our roads thus eliminating thru traffic and extending the life of our roads. And for those of you who were not here to ask the question – yes, it does allow emergency vehicles to enter through the gates.

A record is kept of every decal issued along with information seen on the vehicle registration, such as make and model of the car, license plate, name and address of owner, which is why we ask for a copy of the registration when the decal is placed on the vehicle. Further, the decals are designed to be non transferable, so when you get a new car, get a new decal. And if for any reason you have difficulty going through the gate, please call the Association representative so the problem may be addressed.

And please drive slowly (about 5 mph) through the gates (replacing the gate arms is expensive) and help us keep our community safe by driving no faster than 25 MPH in Myrtle Trace.
