Recently, residents of several communities in Horry County awoke to find Anti-Semitic literature on their driveway. Ours is one of those communities. The frequency and the scale of these actions are rapidly escalating. The individuals or group of extremists hide themselves under the cloak of darkness when distributing this hateful material.

We cannot allow these acts to define us as a people and a nation. And we cannot condone them. We need to raise our voices and loudly condemn these acts. We also need to pressure the lawmakers in South Carolina to quit stalling and pass long needed hate crime legislation.

Anti-Semitism, like racial or cultural discrimination has no place in the United States. If we, the people, allow this to continue we risk a repeat of history. It is imperative that we stand united against these hateful acts.

or in their dog run. Recently we have received several phone calls of dogs running through residents' property or up and down Myrtle Trace Drive. Dogs are not to be on the golf course at any time per golf course signage. We have a good working relationship with the golf course personnel and we would like that relationship to continue. Also, if your dog tends to be a barker, we know dogs bark; please consider your neighbors and if the dog is barking incessantly, bring him/her inside.

In the November issue of the News & Views suggestions, such as leaving on exterior lights or installing dusk to dawn and motion detector lights, were offered to discourage prowlers. It seems some home owners have not considered the proximity of their neighbors and are using high wattage bulbs. We ask that you check with your neighbor to see if the wattage is so bright that the light is creating a problem with their sleep. If so, please switch out the bulb to a lower wattage. The effect for deterring prowlers will be the same.

AREA HOA MEETING

Several presidents, of area HOA's met on Wednesday, December14th to discuss topics of common concerns. The topics included: paving of Burning Ridge Road, noise abatement, exiting, or trying to exit onto Myrtle Ridge Drive and lighting on Burning Ridge Road. The noise from truck traffic coming from construction of the new housing development, and the increase of traffic on Myrtle Ridge Drive is becoming a problem to residents in several development communities, Myrtle Trace being one.

A second issue is the problem getting out onto Myrtle Ridge Drive. The number of cars on Myrtle Ridge Drive is rapidly increasing and will only get worse once the Ridgefield development is completed. We would like to know if a traffic light will be installed at some point or how the traffic problem will be addressed. We don't believe the roundabout being built will benefit the traffic situation in any respect. We hope to get some help and answers from our new District 8 County Councilman, Mikey Masciarelli. He did attend a portion of our meeting and told us about himself and his involvement when he served on the county planning board. However, due to prior commitments of several HOA representatives we did not have an opportunity to express and discuss our concerns.

The area HOA's have been meeting for the last three years. I know this year there will be some changes in leadership in at least two of the HOA Board of Directors. I hope this group continues to meet and take on issues of common interest and concern because a group voice is more powerful and has a stronger influence than one HOA.




