#### **BOARD BRIEFS**

At the September public Board meeting the Board adopted a number of changes to the ARC guidelines. The changes were published in the September News & Views and after discussion with the ARC committee and barring any public comment, the changes were adopted by the Board and will be published in the annual packet for insertion in homeowner's notebooks.

The Board is also recommending a change to the policy on the parking of Recreational Vehicles. The proposed change is listed below in bold print and will be subject to review at the October 18<sup>th</sup> Board meeting.

#### CHANGE TO THE POLICY ON LOADING AND UNLOADING OF RECREATIONAL VEHICLES

A permit is required prior to the parking of recreational vehicles, including travel trailers, boats and motor homes in Myrtle Trace residents' driveways. The permit will allow 24 hours for the purpose of loading and 24 hours for unloading of the above mentioned vehicles. Permits may be requested from any member of the Board of Directors or the Chairperson of the ARC Committee.

#### • THE MYRTLE TRACE WEBSITE

Our website, **myrtletracesc.org**, is a source of information for our current residents, future residents, and for those interested in knowing what Myrtle Trace is all about. It's the place to go to review our Covenants and Guidelines, to catch up on activities and committee reports, to review Board of Directors actions, to read past copies of News & Views, and to print out forms such as ARC project requests, emergency contact forms, common ground agreements, etc.

The website is constantly being updated and will be upgraded, making it more accessible and user friendly. Our new webmaster is Joe Martin who works closely with our Communications Committee and the Board to maintain the website and provide current residents with the information they need to be good neighbors and to be able to appreciate what Myrtle Trace has to offer.

Myrtletracesc.org is designed to be convenient and informational but is not interactive. Should you have questions about the content of the website or any information you find there, you are encouraged to contact any of the current Board members or appropriate committee members, all of whom are listed on the website and in your Myrtle Trace Directory.

However, neither our website nor our monthly newsletter are used for emergency communications. Should we have to send an emergency notice out to the community, we use an email list maintained by Jon Bourne and we rely on neighbors communicating with those in our community who may not have access to email. And the latter is what makes Myrtle Trace the special place that it is.

#### ROADS – LOOKING BOTH WAYS

#### A QUICK LOOK BACK—

Until about 15 years ago there was only one way in and out of Myrtle Trace and that was the front entrance at Burning Ridge Road. There was a permanent barrier at the other end of Myrtle Trace Drive blocking access to a rutted dirt path which is now Myrtle Ridge Road. Once Myrtle Ridge Road was paved, Horry County insisted that we remove the barrier to allow non-resident traffic to pass through our community. As with most developments, the County had been granted a right of way in return for maintaining the roads.

It quickly became apparent that our roads were not built to handle that kind of traffic and our residents' safety became a major concern. In 2008, we obtained a court order to rescind the County's right of way – thus making our roads private. We secured the deed to the property underneath the roads from International Paper. The court stipulated that the Association would maintain the roads and that we would provide access to Myrtle Ridge Road to our residents and emergency vehicles.

The Association's response was twofold: a reserve fund for road maintenance was established which is used for major road projects and is added to annually, and the entrance and exit gates at the end of Myrtle Trace Drive were installed.

#### A LOOK AHEAD—

A lot of research and expertise went into designing and implementing the back entrance. Maintaining our roads requires an equal amount of expertise and planning. Working with the Property Committee, recent Boards, and Hardee Maintenance, Tom Gray has designed a plan that has already resulted in the milling and paving of many of our streets, the widening of Pear Tree Circle, root removal, geological studies of the road beds and numerous other road repairs.

This year's budget preparation was influenced by the next step of the plan which is to mill and resurface Myrtle Trace Drive between Berry Tree Lane and Cedar Ridge Road in early 2024. While we can and have planned ahead for the budget requirements, we have to rely on our residents to provide the cooperation and patience needed to complete such a major project successfully. So buckle up for the necessary inconvenience in 2024 and for a smooth ride down Myrtle Trace Drive (AT 25 MPH)!


The board approved the budget at the September 20, 2023 meeting. The budget document will be included in the packets distributed to all homeowners for the 2024 annual meeting,
