BOARD BRIEFS

PROJECTS AND PLANS—At our November 15th meeting we approved 2 projects that have been in the planning stages for some time. We approved the bid from Palmetto Paving to mill and pave the length of Myrtle Trace Drive between Berry Tree Lane and Cedar Ridge Lane, and the milling and paving of Laurelwood Lane. Over the years we have built up a road fund to cover the cost of our road projects, and thanks to good planning over the years we are able to cover the cost of this project without depleting those designated funds.

In preparation for a project of this scale, we have also established a new position on the Property Committee to help work out the details of paving Myrtle Trace Drive. The job of the "Coordinator of Special Road Projects" will include working with utility companies, our contractor, and our residents to identify and accommodate special needs, and to ensure a good working environment so the job can be completed quickly with minimal inconvenience to our residents. Liz Maass has retired from her position as Property Chair and has agreed to help with this project by assuming the new position of Road Project Coordinator. While we appreciate and thank Liz for her years of service as Chair of the Property Committee, we believe that this will make good use of her experience and standing in the community.

We formally accepted the Palmetto Paving bid thus locking in the price. We expect the work to be done early next year. This is a big road project and we hope we can rely on the patience and cooperation of our fellow residents. The end result will be worth our efforts.

The second planned project is the dredging of Lake Heron. We accepted a proposal from Total Lake Care to "remove pine straw and debris within approximately 600 square feet of area with all harvested material transported offsite". Access will be at the spillway near Burning Ridge Road and work will begin in December or early next year. Keeping our ponds functional and attractive is a work in progress which is often affected by the whims of nature.

We also approved the removal of 2 dead trees on common property near the intersection of Burning Ridge Road and Myrtle Trace Drive at the 4-way stop.

THE WEBSITE: myrtletracesc.org—Part of our meeting was dedicated to a discussion of our website. We're working on a policy which will determine the content of the website. We already agreed that the website is informational and not interactive and that it is useful to residents and prospective buyers as it contains the Covenants, Guidelines, Policies, News & Views, and access to forms. Our job over the next few months is to determine what other information should be included such as committee minutes, Board minutes, contact information and picture galleries. If you have thoughts on the content of the website. please share them with any member of the Board or the Communications Committee Chair, Mary Schaeffer.

POOL PERSON RESPONSIBILITIES

- Opens and closes pool each spring/fall.
- Works with volunteer crew to set up and break down furniture.
- Before pool is opened, clean up before opening.
- Ensure pool company is performing proper maintenance.
- Supervise Head Pool Monitor who is in charge of daily pool monitors.
- Liaison with pool service company.
- Attend Property Committee meetings.
- Interact with Property Committee to ensure repairs/maintenance is done in a timely manner.
- Ensure license is posted.
- Record and maintain daily inspection book.
- Work with Property Committee to establish a budget for pool needs ex: cover, furniture, mechanical needs, etc.
- Be the Pool Complaint Department. Listen to concerns and suggestions of residents.
- When any significant concerns and/or problems arise, report at Property meeting.
- Interface with DHEC.

HEAD POOL MONITOR RESPONSIBILITIES

- Lists monitors and closers on a calendar schedule.
- List any substitute monitors and phone numbers.
- Ensure a sub fills available time slot if scheduled monitor isn't available to find a sub themselves.
- Ensures monitors are aware of need for all residents and guests to sign in for an accurate headcount.
- Makes everyone aware that guests must be signed in by a resident.
- Keep sign-in sheets so they can be filed.
- Has forms available to monitors to report rules and/or violations that require Board action. These are brought up at Property meeting.
- Has pool rules available at pool for guests, especially those with children.


