BOARD BRIEFS

This is the time of year when we often look back over the events of the past year and plan for the upcoming year. It's also the time of year when we resolve to eat less and exercise more. Here are ten other New Year's resolutions to consider:

- 1) Read News & Views—We are often overwhelmed with the amount of information available to us and while we may find it easy to "go online" for information, remember that News & Views is the official communication linking the Board and its committees with you, our residents. A good example of information which you may miss if you don't read News & Views is the announcement you'll find in this issue about the upcoming Primary elections.
- 2) Drive 25—that's 25MPH on Myrtle Trace Drive and 5MPH when you approach the back gate. If you drive slowly near the gate and still experience problems, call Nancy Seeds.
- 3) Worry less—If you worry about the ponds flooding your house and property, you can scratch that off your list. We just experienced a major rain event and the ponds did exactly what they are designed to do they retained the runoff and the rain (they are retention ponds). During a heavy rain the water level will often rise above the retaining walls and that's OK. The retaining walls are not a measure of the depth of the water they are designed to protect the lake banks from erosion. Our retention ponds are part of a larger drainage system which flows into the county's "big ditch" and ultimately to the ocean. The drainage system has worked for 40 years and handled hurricanes which dumped a lot more rain than what we experienced this past month. And we take precautions: before a major weather event our maintenance crew checks the swales and drains that are on common property to clear them of debris. You may want to do the same on your private property.
- 4) Respect your neighbor's property—And that includes the common property. You probably wouldn't rake or blow leaves onto your next door neighbor's property. The same holds true of the common property. It may be tempting, especially when no one is looking, but the common ground is not for dumping and that includes the wooded areas. The only time that we should expect Hardee Maintenance to pick up debris piled at the front of our properties near the road is after a named storm when they pick up and dispose of fallen trees and large tree limbs. Our ponds are also common ground and not a place for you or your landscaper to throw grass clippings.
- 5) Be a volunteer—join a committee.
- 6) Be kind and courteous to Board and Committee members—we are all volunteers and neighbors and are doing the best we can to serve our community.
- 7) Remember #6.
- 8) Read # 6 again.
- 9) Enjoy being part of a great community and all that it has to offer.
- 10) Don't forget #6 and have a happy, healthy New Year!

VOLUNTEERS NEEDED for Phase 6 & Phase 7 Representative positions. See the following Job description:

PROPERTY PHASE REP. RESPONSIBILITIES—Please read in your Guidelines Binder under Tab B the Property Committee Guidelines to familiarize yourself with the rules and regulations this Committee is responsible for.

When receiving a complaint from a resident:

- 1. Write down the resident's name, address and phone number.
- 2. Have the resident describe the complaint.
- 3. Even if a solution has been completed, present the complaint at our next meeting and your procedure or need to solve the resident's problem. Omit their name and just provide the address.

If complaint is regarding:

- 1. Trees on HOA Property. Take a look. Contact Property person taking care of trees and describe the problem.
- 2. Flooding. Go to the resident's property to see where flooding is occurring. If on personal property, they are to contact ARC. If retaining walls, they are to contact ARC. If flooding is caused by retention ponds, contact the Property person in charge of lakes and give them all the information so they can take a look.
- 3. If a street light goes out or is flickering. Go check out the light. There is a number on a white piece of paper affixed towards the bottom of the pole. Call Santee Cooper with the number: 1-888-769-7688. Let them know the light is out and give them the ID pole number. It takes approximately 48 hours for a resolution.
- 4. Maintenance Agreement or Sod Replacement form is in the Guidelines Binder. They are to make a copy of form. Fill it out and drop off at Clubhouse slot under HOA.
- 5. Roads, signs, gate, Clubhouse, pool, sports complex. Get the information and contact the person in charge.

If you are not sure who to contact, please call either the Property Chair or Property Vice-Chair for direction. All members of the committee are listed on the back page of the Community Telephone Directory.

SAFE DRIVING AND SAFE WALKING

Pedestrians and drivers share the roads in Myrtle Trace. It is the time of year when dawn is late and night is early. Please be vigilant and careful when driving or walking along our streets, especially Myrtle Trace Drive.

Pedestrians, please remember to walk facing oncoming traffic. You will avoid any surprises from a vehicle approaching you from behind your field of view. Myrtle Trace Drive has several curves in its design and there is a risk of not being visible to approaching drivers. Also, please be safe and yield the roadway to approaching vehicles. Finally, if you are walking during twilight hours or after dark, wear reflective clothing and carry a bright light.

Drivers face challenges from sunlight, darkness and obstructions along our roads. Please remain alert for pedestrians, geese and other possible hazards on our roads. The winter sunlight may reduce visibility to zero so please remember that the speed limit on Myrtle Trace Drives is 25 miles per hour. Also, our stop signs are not *suggestions*. Cars and bicycles have been observed ignoring our signs. This creates a serious hazard to other drivers and pedestrians.

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BEAVER ACTIVITY NEAR MYRTLE TRACE

Myrtle Trace residents and the Hardee Maintenance Team have reported sightings of beavers in "the ditch" along the perimeter of our community. This channel conveys water drained from Myrtle Trace to the Intercoastal Waterway. It is a key element of flood prevention. Beavers have constructed dams in the ditch and impeded the flow of water. Once again, the Board notified the Horry County Storm Water Department. A representative from the department dispatched a trapper to locate the beavers and then work with the SC Department of Natural Resources (DNR) to trap and remove the beavers.

JANUARY LAWN CARE TIPS

Take time to service equipment and sharpen blades for the upcoming growing season. This is also a great time to get a soil test done to determine pH and nutrient levels.
