BOARD BRIEFS

SAFETY ON MYRTLE TRACE ROADS—Tuesday, March 19, 2024, marked the first day of spring. The arrival of spring was preceded by the beginning of daylight savings time. Improving weather conditions encourage many residents to return to walking or biking along our roads. Please put safety first! Remember that drivers must see you and later sunrise and sunset times make visibility difficult. Please wear reflective clothing and carry a flashlight if you walk when it is dark. Also walk facing oncoming traffic. We ask all drivers to be extra vigilant along our roadways. Pedestrians, as well as feathered and furry friends, are more likely to be sharing the road with you. Let's safely celebrate the return of spring.

PLEASE DO NOT FEED MIGRATORY WATERFOWL—Federal, State of South Carolina, and Horry County all prohibit feeding migratory waterfowl. Our local retention ponds host geese, ducks, cormorants, swans as well as other waterfowl who stop over. Feeding waterfowl may cause them to be dependent on our generosity. But most of the items in our bird feeders don't provide all the nutrients needed by waterfowl. Worse, intentional feeding of waterfowl may encourage them to forgo their annual migration. A large resident population of migratory waterfowl are often considered "pests" by communities. Please comply with the laws and do not feed the waterfowl.

CONFIDENTIAL EMERGENCY CONTACT LIST—Thank you to the more than 50 residents who completed and submitted emergency contact information. The Board is very happy to report such a response and reminds all residents that the forms are always available at the Clubhouse. All information on the forms is confidential and retained in secured files. Contact Susan Granger at 518-779-8933 for more information.

THE BEAVER - **AGAIN**—The Board, as well as the Property Committee, have received several reports of beaver sightings. Once again, the beaver was located in "the ditch" located between the new access road and Myrtle Trace Drive. Beaver(s) have also been spotted swimming in Tern Lake. Once again, the stormwater manager office was contacted and the location of the beaver reported. Per the county, a licensed trapper will be engaged and necessary permits obtained to trap and remove the beaver.

BOARD ACTION TO BE TAKEN—The Property Committee has made the following recommended two changes to the 2024 pool rules:

- 1. The pool is for the use of residents, their family and/or guests of a resident. (replaces: The pool is for the use of residents, their family and/or out of town house guests only.)
- 2. Children under the age of 16 may use the pool only when accompanied by a resident or a designated, responsible adult.

(replaces: Children under the age of 16 may use the pool only when accompanied by the resident they are staying with or a responsible adult.)

Having published these proposed changes in this issue of News and Views, the Board will entertain comments and vote at the April 17, 2024 meeting.

Below are the proposed pool rules for this season pending Board approval:

MYRTLE TRACE POOL RULES (* notes recommended change for 2024)

The pool is for the use of residents, their family and/or guests of a resident.* All users are to comply with the posted Department of Health Environmental Control (DHEC) regulations and the following rules:

POOL HOURS: 8:00 A.M. to 9:00 P.M. daily

8:00 A.M. to 10:00 A.M.——ADULTS ONLY (9:00 A.M. to 10:00 A.M. - MAY LAP SWIM).
10:00 A.M. to 5:30 P.M.——OPEN SWIMMING - A responsible adult must accompany children.
5:30 P.M. to 9:00 P.M.——ADULTS ONLY - May Lap Swim 7:00 P.M. to 8:00 P.M. ONLY.
No swimming after 9:00 P.M.—POOL CLOSED.

PETS are not permitted in the pool fenced area.

- Residents are required to sign in and list any guests with the pool monitor that is on duty.
- After 5:30 P.M. sign in sheets are located on the table under the cabana roof.
- Swim at your own risk. Swimming alone is strongly discouraged.
- The Pool Monitor is there to see that our rules are obeyed and not to be a lifeguard.

Children under the age of 16 may use the pool only when accompanied by a resident or a designated responsible adult.* Children of diaper age must wear diapers approved for swimming pool use. Parents are responsible for any accident that results from their child. Otherwise, the child will not be allowed in the pool and must use the portable pool. There is a portable pool located in the storage room for their use. Water may be bucketed from the pool to the toddler pool. When draining the toddler pool, please make sure the water is dumped away from the swimming pool and into the grassy area.

- Appropriate swimming attire must be worn.
- Diving into the pool is **NOT PERMITTED.** Jumping will be permitted only when it does not interfere with the safety or enjoyment of the other swimmers.
- Inflatable Safety & Flotation devices for non-swimming children are permitted only under the proper supervision of a responsible adult and only in the shallow end of the pool. Rafts, inner tubes, fins and snorkels are **NOT PERMITTED**. Children's toys and devices not designed for water sports and play are also **NOT PERMITTED**.

- No playing on or removing of lifeline ropes **EXCEPT** during **SCHEDULED ADULT** lap swim times: (9:00 A.M. 10:00 A.M; And 7:00 P.M. 8:00 P.M.). The rope may be disconnected **ONLY** when an adult is actively lap swimming and MUST REMAIN CONNECTED at all other times.
- CLEAR POOL AREA and go outside the fenced area upon the first incident of THUNDER and/or LIGHTNING. The pool will remain closed and the gates locked until 30 minutes after the last signs of a storm have passed.
- NO SMOKING OR VAPING inside pool fenced area.
- Deposit all trash in the trash receptacles.
- Upon leaving the pool area, please return all flotation noodles to the storage room. Please close your umbrella.
- LAST PERSON LEAVING POOL AREA IS TO LOCK THE POOL GATES.

SOD REPLACEMENT

For HOA front lawns that are not growing or are bare, the sod replacement forms are in three places: Your MTHOA Guidelines book, our website or in the wall hanger in the Clubhouse by the phone. Fill it out and drop in the HOA slot. You will be apprised if you are approved for sod and the date it will be installed. Please keep the new sod well watered for at least three weeks for the roots to take. Forms are due by April 30, 2024, and can be dropped in the MTHOA slot in the Clubhouse by the phone. Residents who are approved to maintain their own HOA frontage are not eligible for sod replacement from the MTHOA.
