#### \* LANDSCAPE REQUEST FROM GRAND STRAND WATER AND SEWER

Grand Strand Water and Sewer Authority reminds all residents that landscaping near water meter boxes or fire hydrants should be kept trimmed. The Authority requests a three-foot work area clear of all landscaping to allow testing and repair of their equipment. The Board recommends that residents maintain this three-foot work area rather than allowing Authority's crews to create the space. Repair crews are not landscape gardeners and charge for the effort.

The Board also reminds residents that Myrtle Trace is approaching its 41<sup>st</sup> anniversary. Water mains and water lines are also approaching that age. Grand Strand Water and Sewer Authority continues to offer Service Line Maintenance covering their lines up to the home. #### PROPERTY COMMITTEE

HAIL AND FAREWELL—Paul Sallas, who represented Phase 5 for over a decade, stepped down from his role this month. Paul was knowledgeable of our community and contributed much of his time and energy working to improve Myrtle Trace. He was always willing to voice solid recommendations and was willing to participate in implementing selected solutions. A heartfelt thank you from the Property Committee to Paul for his support to the committee and Myrtle Trace.

**PONDS**—This spring has had below average rainfall. As a result, our retention ponds water level has dropped to low levels, as well. These are not natural bodies of water with the primary source of water being rain runoff. There are three wells that provide supplementary water but the county restricts how much can be drawn from the wells. Also, running the well pumps makes a noticeable increase in our electric bill. These hot, sunny days lead to a high level of evapotranspiration. This is evaporation directly from the water surface into the air and transpiration which is water absorbed by a plant's roots that travels through the stem or trunk and then released into the air through the leaves. Our lake contractor comes on a regular basis to monitor the ponds and apply treatment when necessary. These low levels stress the fish living in the ponds, as well as facilitate the growth of algae. The contractor needs to know what is the maximum amount of algaecide that can be used. Applying too much could result in so much dead algae that the oxygen level can drop resulting in a massive fish kill.

The other concern is we are now in hurricane season. A tropical system or a severe thunderstorm could easily fill the ponds to overflow. The ponds

require management from knowledgeable people. Many residents would like to see the ponds totally free of algae but the weather, especially this time of year, does not allow that.

FISHING—Residents have asked what is the policy regarding fishing in light of all the "NO FISHING" signs placed throughout Myrtle Trace. The policy has not changed. Residents and house guests are permitted recreational fishing in all common area ponds. Any fish caught must be released back into the pond. All fishing must be from Common Property only. Trespassing on private property is not permitted. The "NO FISHING, NO TRESPASSING", and "NO DUMPING" signs are intended to keep non-residents from doing these activities on Myrtle Trace property. These postings are useful in the event of non-residents repeatedly violating these postings or refusing to stop whereby the police need to be called.

A comment about fishing. Yes, there are fish in our retention ponds but the ponds are not ideal fish habitat. We do a limited amount of stocking of fish into the ponds with the goal they will control aquatic insects, feed on plants and maintain a pseudo-natural ecosystem. There are only a limited number of species recommended for the ponds. Residents should not release bait fish or any other (aquarium) fish in the ponds. This is one way invasive fish get into the natural waterways. We lose some fish to natural predators (osprey, raccoons, etc). Even catch and release will stress fish and will result in the death of some. It is important to thoroughly wash and/or use disinfectant on any body part that comes in contact with the pond water or anything from the pond. There are harmful bacteria and chemicals that wash into the ponds. A better choice would be to fish in a natural waterway managed by the DNR.

Duties of the Accounts Payable Contractor include, but are not limited to, the following:

- Maintain Association financial records in a manner normally associated with generally accepted accounting principles. All records will be backed-up in a manner mutually agreed upon by the Association and Accounts Payable.
- After obtaining the necessary signed approvals for all bills, submit prepared checks (with supporting documentation) to Board members for signature. After final approval, pay bills in a timely manner according to the practice established by the Board of Directors.
- Accounts Payable shall be alert to deaths occurring in the community and shall prepare and send a check for a memorial donation to the organization chosen by the family of the deceased Association member.
- Provide the Contract Administrator with monthly records.
- Accounts payable shall be bonded in an amount determined by the Board of Directors.
- All records shall be computerized.
- Accounts Payable shall be responsible for a petty cash fund to be maintained at one hundred (\$100) dollars cash to effect payment or reimbursement for small purchases or deliveries.
- Accounts Payable will provide orientation, training, and relevant updating relative to the responsibilities under this contract to an individual(s) designated by the Board of Directors.
- Any other reasonable duties to be agreed upon by the Board of Directors for the Association and Accounts Payable.
- Accounts Payable represents and acknowledges that they are an independent contractor and not an employee of the Association.
- Accounts Payable shall provide, at their own expense and on their own premises, the necessary equipment, software and supplies for the performance of the agreed services. Check forms are provided by the Association.

The agreement can be terminated, without cause, upon thirty (30) days written notice by either party.


