BOARD BRIEFS

Safety First—The Board has been notified that some residents enjoying the pool have not vacated the pool area during thunderstorms. Lightning's behavior is random and unpredictable and swimming pools are connected to a much larger surface area via underground water pipes, electric and telephone wiring. Lightning strikes to the ground anywhere on this metallic network may induce shocks elsewhere. Please put safety first and vacate the pool area inside the fence when thunderstorms approach. OSHA guidelines recommend waiting 30 minutes after a storm passes before re-entering the pool area.

2024 South Carolina Hurricane Guide—The 2024 Hurricane Guide was delivered to Myrtle Trace homes along with the July issue of News and Views. Special thanks to Laura DiFiore and Dorothy Blair for their resourcefulness in obtaining a sufficient supply of the guide ensuring all homes received a copy.

Mark Your Calendar—The Council of Past Presidents will present a New Resident Orientation on Sunday, September 8, from 2-4 p.m. in the Myrtle Trace Clubhouse. This session will be an opportunity for new residents to ask questions that may have arisen since your move to Myrtle Trace. Look for more information in next month's News and Views. But please save the date.

Nominating Committee—February 1st, 2025, is the date of the 2025 Myrtle Trace Annual Meeting. During the annual meeting, two new members of the Board will be elected. The nominating committee will convene in September to seek candidates for the positions. Board Vice-President, Susan Granger, heads this very important effort.

Item for Board Action – Proposed ARC Guideline Changes—Due to color eliminations and name changes by area paint suppliers, we must update our driveway/walkway paint selections. We also want to add two lighter colors. The paragraph regarding approved coating materials will now read:

- * Approved Solid Acrylic Concrete Stain coating materials for Phases I through VIII are: Gray Horizons, Gull Grey, Pearl Gray, Silver Gray, Accessible Beige and Cemented Deal.
- * Brick Accent color Terra Cotta is approved only along the sides of the driveways, walkways and expansion joints, but not along the street.

Summer Vacation and Visitors—Summer is in full swing and we have visitors enjoying our community. Many guests bring along their cherished pets. Please remind visitors to clean up after their pet while out enjoying our community's common ground.

Monthly Lawn Care Recommendation—During periods of environmental stress due to high temperatures or a lack of rainfall, raise the mowing height ½ to 1 inch until the stress is eliminated. Always mow with a sharp blade using a mulching type mower which leaves the clippings to decompose on the turf. The mower blade needs to be sharpened on a regular basis – usually about once a month. If your mower has a bag and is picking up soil, especially sand, when the lawn is mowed, then the blade may need to be sharpened more often than once a month. 
