### **BOARD BRIEFS**

### ITEM FOR BOARD ACTION—PROPOSED ARC GUIDELINE CHANGES

The Architectural Review Committee (ARC) must approve all changes to home exteriors. This includes, but is not limited to, additions or modifications to screened porches, sunrooms, external doors including storm doors, windows, skylights, decks, patios and attached storage areas. Some of the above may require building permits in accordance with the state of South Carolina, the county of Horry, or both. In such instances it is the responsibility of the Homeowner and/or their contractor to assume the responsibility for obtaining these as required. The color of any painted addition must match that of the house.

Any embellishments to the house, including but not limited to, decorative items visible to others must also be approved.

MARK YOUR CALENDAR—FEBRUARY 1, 2025 is the date of the 2025 Myrtle Trace Annual Meeting. During the annual meeting, 2 new members of the Board will be elected. The Nominating Committee has convened and is seeking candidates for these positions. Board Vice-President, Susan Granger, heads this very important effort.

**DEVELOPMENT BEHIND MYRTLE TRACE DRIVE NEAR WALMART**—Residents have noted that many trees near Walmart have been cleared. The Board contacted Horry County Planning as well as Stormwater departments. The properties are zoned **Highway Commercial**. These zones are typically located along major roadways such as Highway 501 and Highway 17 Bypass. Currently, no building permits have been issued for the site. The stormwater plan specifies commercial development including retention ponds. We will continue to monitor the situation and notify the community of building plans when they become available

**2024 GENERAL ELECTION**—The Clubhouse will close at 4PM on Monday, November 4<sup>th</sup>, and remain closed on Tuesday, November 5<sup>th</sup>, for the general election. The Clubhouse will re-open for activities on Wednesday, November 6<sup>th</sup>.

Note that South Carolina early voting begins Monday, October 21 – Saturday, November 2. (Closed Sunday October 27.) Early voting centers are open 8:30 a.m.- 6:00 p.m. during the early voting period. Voters can visit any early voting center in their county during the early voting period. ### PROPERTY COMMITTEE

#### \* PONDS

One of the challenges with our retention ponds is excessive plant growth during the summer months. This plant growth is a direct result of an abundance of nutrients in the pond water. Residents can help reduce this nutrient load by not using commercial fertilizer within 25 feet of the water's edge. Commercial fertilizers are designed to rapidly dissolve so they are easily absorbed by plants in the water. It is also important to not allow grass clippings to blow into the ponds when cutting lawns. When washing outdoor furniture or cars, check that the soap does not contain phosphates. Phosphates are particularly important to plant growth. Waterfowl should not be fed by residents. It is illegal in Horry County, can be harmful to birds, and their droppings add nutrients to the ponds as well as potentially harmful bacteria.

### \* DRAINAGE

Our community was designed with 15 retention ponds to regulate excessive stormwater runoff. There are also a series of swales or ditches to carry stormwater to the ponds or to other county drainage routes. Please check to ensure that these ditches are clear of plant growth or other debris. If the ditch is on a residents' property, the resident is responsible to keep it clear. If a ditch is on common property and needs attention, please contact your property phase representative to get it addressed. Please do not deposit tree limbs and other plant debris into common areas. The county offers several locations where this material can be dropped off and ground into mulch. We are still in hurricane season so it is important that drainage routes are clear. Thank you.

### 2023 Audit Results

The independent audit of the HOA financial statements has been completed and a report delivered. I am pleased to report there are no deficiencies reported!

Highlights noted by the independent auditor:

The auditor has analyzed the tax positions taken by the association and has concluded that as of December 31, 2023 there are no uncertain positions taken or expected to be taken that would require recognition of a liability or disclosure in the financial statements.

The HOA elected to report its revenues and expenses on an accrual basis. Consequently, revenues and expenses are recognized when the revenues are earned rather than received and when the expenses are incurred rather than paid. Example: Prepaid dues in Jan., 2023 of \$1,020 are recognized each month when earned vs when received.

Cash, cash equivalents and certificates of deposit balances held at financial institutions are insured up to \$250,000 by the FDIC. The association's Board of Directors regularly monitors the financial condition of the banking institutions to minimize the risk of loss due to uninsured balances.

The association's governing documents require funds be accumulated for future major repairs and replacements. The association's board of directors estimates the remaining useful lives and replacement costs of the common property components. As of Dec. 31, 2023, estimated replacement costs totaled \$276,816 and designated fund balances available were \$500,425.

The auditor's report opinion (the good news:)

The financial statements present fairly, in all material respects, the financial position of the Myrtle Trace Homeowners Association, Inc as of December 31, 2023, and the results of its operations and its cashflows for the years then ended in conformity with accounting principles generally accepted in the United States of America.

- Assist in preparation of the monthly financial report and year-to-date summary data.
- Assist in preparation of the necessary 1099 forms to all contractors/persons who are eligible to receive them.
- Assist the Administrative Consultant in performing the duties of the Association's Contract Administrator for all contracts assigned by the Board of Directors.
- The Assistant Administrative Consultant shall support the updating and maintenance of a database showing the Homeowner compliance to Article VI, Section 5 of the Covenants requiring homeowners to maintain homeowner's insurance covering full replacement cost and to provide the Association with proof of said insurance in full force and effect. The insurance database shall be updated on a regular basis and reports of homeowner compliance will be provided to the Board of Directors upon request.
- Assistant Administrative Contractor shall be available for other duties as requested by the Board of Directors.

The Assistant Administrative Consultant acknowledges that they are an independent contractor and not an employee of the Association.

The agreement can be terminated, without cause, upon thirty (30) days written notice by either party.

Continue to mow the centipede grass lawn at the normal mowing height until the weather starts to cool in the fall. Once nighttime temperatures fall below 70 °F, raise the mower blade height to approximately 2 inches to allow for more leaf surface. This will allow the turf to become acclimated by the time the first frost occurs.
